This is a list of frequently asked questions about the S&P Global 1200.

1. Which indices are included in the S&P Global 1200?

The S&P Global 1200 includes seven headline indices covering 29 countries that combine to give a representative, easily replicable snapshot of the global equity markets. The indices are market capitalization weighted and free float adjusted. Index constituents are leading companies from each of the 10 sectors of the Global Industry Classification Standard (GICS). 2. How are the S&P Global 1200 indices constructed?

The S&P Global 1200 indices each contain a fixed number of constituents, which represent the leading, blue chip companies of each market. Stocks are eligible for these indices if they meet criteria for size, liquidity, profitability and sector and market representation. Each component region is balanced across 10 sectors of the Global Industry Classification Standard (GICS). Please click [here](#) for a complete methodology.

5. What are criteria for additions and deletions?

An index addition generally is made only if a vacancy is created by an index deletion. Index additions are made with a view to preserving regional, country and sector representation in the index. Standard & Poor's aims to minimize constituent turnover. Deletions may occur due to delistings, bankruptcy, spin-offs or substantial violations of inclusion criteria. The most common reason for deleting a stock from an S&P index is its acquisition by another company. Click here for a complete methodology.
